She currently serves as a member of the Marilyn Magaram Center Advisory Board at CSUN and has served as a member of the SCUCI Community Advisory Board and Strategic Planning Committee.

An active community volunteer, Lisagor has been involved with VCCF since 1995, when she became a founding member of the Women's Legacy Fund. Since then, she has served on VCCF grant committees and with her husband, Mark, created the Lisagor Family Fund to support the work of the Foundation.
