Since 1991 the Resource Center has provided training, research materials and technical assistance to nonprofit organizations in Ventura County with the goal of strengthening the ability of those organizations to deliver needed services in the community. It is the only center of its kind in the County.

Created in 1987, the Ventura County Community Foundation is a family of charitable funds whose combined assets now exceed \$85 million. Grants made in 2005 are projected at over \$4 million, including more than \$600,000 in scholarships to Ventura County students.
